Tanya Kempston

After graduating with a degree in English Language and Literature from the Queen's University of Belfast in the UK, Miss Tanya Kempston took a PGCE in English and Drama at the same institution. She taught in Belfast and Osaka City, Japan before moving to Hong Kong in 2001, where she was a NET and Head of English Literature at Belilios Public School from 2001-2005.

She was awarded a Master's Degree with Distinction in Drama and Theatre Education by the University of Warwick in the UK in 2006 and now works for the Hong Kong Education and Manpower Bureau NET Section as a Curriculum Officer and Advisory Teacher.

Jenny Wai

After graduating with a degree in English Language and Literature from Hong Kong Baptist University, Miss Jenny Wai took a Master's Degree in English Literary Studies at the University of Durham in the UK in 1996. She then studied for her PGDE with a major in English Language at the Hong Kong Institution of Education. Miss Wai has taught in both primary and secondary schools. Before being seconded to the Education and Manpower Bureau NET Section as an Advisory Teacher, she was the English Panel Chair at Baptist (Sha Tin Wai) Lui Ming Choi Primary School.
